NAMA interprets "Full Time" a little differently than state universities and student loan programs. You will qualify as a full time student if you are attending a school that considers you as a full time student in good standing in one of their certificate or degree programs.

Examples are:

1. Traditional universities and colleges where you are attending 15 credit hours per week.
 2. Schools where you are enrolled in a one weekend per month program for 12 or more consecutive months.
 3. Distance learning programs where the curriculum, hours and certification is equivalent to that school's conventional programs.
- **Expiration Date:** (There is a time limit to the Student category. A person may be considered for Student status in 1 and 2 above for a maximum of 3 years [initial enrollment date from Oct 2005] and for 3 above for a maximum of 1 year [initial enrollment date from Oct 2007])

Examples that do NOT qualify are: weekend seminars, summer intensives, etc.
